# What is Articulated Credit?

High school students taking Career and Technical Education coursework at their high school or career center may be able to earn community college credit because the high school course content duplicates college coursework. High school and career center schools that are members of the Valley Education for Employment System are eligible to participate in articulation agreements between VALEES, Waubonsee Community College, Joliet Junior College, Kishwaukee College and College of DuPage.

# APPLICATION FOR ARTICULATED CREDIT

In order to be eligible for articulated credit you must:

- Have taken a course(s) that is eligible for articulated credit. A list of eligible courses may be obtained from your high school guidance counselor or by going to the VALEES web site (www.valees.org).
- Earned an A or B in the class and apply for credit within two years after graduating high school. You may obtain an application by contacting your high school counselor or online at the VALEES web site. An official high school transcript is required.
