Deep in this nation's DNA is an abiding belief in personal liberty and freedom, and, for much of our history, these values often have conflicted with national and state policies. In public education, this conflict plays out under the guise of local control, that is, who should be most responsible for the quality of public education? Should it be the local school district, which is typically governed by a board of education; or state authorities, which usually include the governor, state legislature, and a state board of education; or is public education policy ultimately the responsibility of the President and Congress?

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

Q. How much, if anything, have you heard about the new national standards for teaching reading, writing, and math in grades K through 12, known as the Common Core State


Standards — a great deal, a fair amount, only a little, or nothing at all?

Q. Do you favor or oppose having the teachers in your community use the Common Core State Standards to guide what they teach?






Americans say standardize d tests not helpful

Q. Some teachers believe student standardized tests help them know more about their students' academic achievements. Other teachers believe that student standardized tests do not help them know what to teach.


What do you think? Are student standardized tests helpful, or are they not helpful to teachers?

Q. How supportive are you of the following types of student tests? Are you very supportive, somewhat supportive, not very supportive, or not at all supportive?






Americans say internationa l comparison s matter

The results of a test known as the Program for International Student Assessment, or PISA, were released last December. The test measures the achievement of students living in 65 countries, including the United States.



Americans say finance is biggest problem


Q. What do you think are the biggest problems that the public schools of your community must deal with?






Americans give local schools good grades








Half of Americans give schools nationally a grade of C


Q. How about the public schools in the nation as a whole? What grade would you give the public schools nationally — A, B, C, D, or Fail?






Americans give Obama divided grades on education


